This l-W Placement Manual is prepared as a key resource to assist in your counseling with men anticipating l-W service. Primarily it is a listing of current recommended l-W opportunities.

You will note these openings are listed in three categories; a) church related earning service; b) voluntary service units; and c) overseas Pax service.

The other sections of the manual are important and merit your early and careful study. You likely will use most often the sections listing service openings. We intend to regularly send you up-to-date information on openings for service. You will want to replace such sheets as more current replacements are supplied.

We assume you will send us your suggestions and inform us of your experiences. Thank You.

THE PLACEMENT ADVISOR'S JOB

Pastor will be referring their youth to you for placement counseling for alternative service in l-W. By working with pastors and keeping closely in touch with them you will provide a real service. Let's analyze a placement procedure.

The Placement Sequence

1. The pastor refers the man to the l-W Advisor.
2. An appointment is made and the interview planned.
3. The placement interviews occur.
4. Youth's pastor is asked to complete a personal reference form which is returned to the l-W Advisor.
5. The l-W Advisor registers the youth for the next l-W Training School.
6. An inquiry is sent to l-W pastor/leader or administrative office for current openings in the youth's interest.
7. An application form is submitted for acceptance, together with the pastor's evaluation.
8. The "l-W Service Notice" form is completed and sent to the respective offices.
9. Such personal correspondence as is needed for the boy's help is begun.

Pastor's Referral

Either by letter, phone or by personal contact the youth's pastor will inform you of his youth's service interests and plans. Hopefully, the pastor will make an appointment with you for the youth. If not, secure an appointment at your office at once.

Placement Interviews

You alone will decide how often to meet with the youth. We suggest that you attempt to follow these goals in your discussions with the youth:

- a) Have the youth complete a "Personal Information Form" in every case.
- b) Discuss the service choices available.
- c) Attempt to direct the youth into Pax, VS or mission supporting service, in preference to earning service.
- d) If the youth is young, try to have him defer plans of service until he is 20 years or older.
- e) Discuss any problems or concerns voiced by the youth. You want to alert his pastor of any problems indicated.

Pastor's Evaluation

At this time have the pastor complete a personal reference form to be used later. This form is sent with an application later for the youth's acceptance into any of the four alternatives for l-W.

Service Choices

We urge you to heartily stress VS, Pax and mission supporting l-W in your counseling. The church would like to see all of her men in one of these preferred l-W alternatives. The folder Service Choices For Men is helpful. Folders on Pax, and VS will be provided.

l-W Training Schools

All pre-l-Ws must attend a l-W Training School. The youth's expenses will be paid in full, so distance is not a relevant hinderance. A Training School will be offered approximately every six months. The l-W Director will announce the schedules well in advance. Attendance is a pre-requisite to service.

Service Inquiries

When the youth is clear how he wishes to serve, you may make specific inquiries for openings. If his interest is in VS or Pax the Board of Christian Service or MCC will handle the matter further, directly with you and the youth. His application (Personal Information Form) and his pastor's evaluation should be sent immediately for consideration and action. On mission supporting service or other earning l-W service, you will want to write or phone to the l-W pastor/leader for specific openings. You may want to explore several locations simultaneously. After deciding on an offer, the youth's application and pastor's evaluation should be forwarded for consideration by the unit leader/pastor.

Service Notice

As soon as a youth's l-W service beginning date is definite, you are to complete the quadruple "l-W Service Notice" form and mail them as directed. This is a vital service to us in l-W administration.

Draft Problems

In all cases where problems arise regarding Selective Service, for example, classification, assignment difficulties, etc., you are expected to refer the matter with all haste to your nearest MCC Peace Counselor. (See the list in the back of the Manual).

Material and Supplies

Supplies of all materials needed in your placement advisor work, are available without cost, upon request. A post card is sufficient to inform us of your need.

DEFINITION OF RESPONSIBILITIES

I. Congregations

1. 1-W mailing lists
2. Peace education
3. Orientation: local level 1-W classes - area annual or semi-annual sessions
4. Placement process; pastors role
5. 1-W recognition and commissioning
6. Sending of letters and literature, subscriptions, tapes, etc.
7. Offering associate membership certificates to man while away

II. State 1-W Advisors (nominated by District Peace & Service Committee and appointed by Board of Christian Service)

1. Maintain a list of men from his state, who plan 1-W service
2. Placement and problem counseling
3. Implementing orientation activities in areas and congregations
4. Liaison with congregations
5. Publicity on the local and state level
6. Liaison with state Selective Service Offices

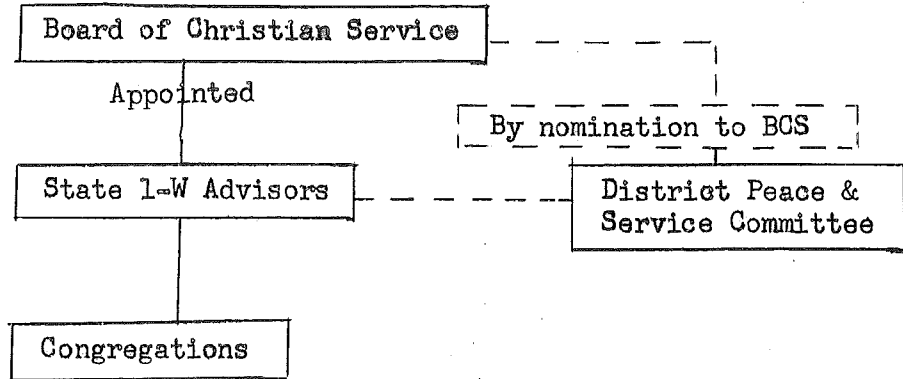
Note: In each District one state advisor would be designated by that district's Peace and Service Committee as the official spokesman or leader of the Advisors in the District. His special functions would include:

- a) Represent P & S concerns in both directions
- b) District wide promotion and publicity
- c) Nominations for unit leaders, contact men, etc.
- d) BCS contact men (probably) on: Placement - Orientation - 1-W units in area

III. 1-W Office (Board of Christian Service)

1. Liaison with 1-W Coordination Board
2. Prepare orientation materials
3. Direct the placement services and coordinate the same
4. Provide training for state counselors, etc.
5. Issue monthly 1-W placement and services bulletin
6. Appoint unit leaders or sponsors when needed
7. Share programs, concerns, and handle all publicity and promotion

Administrative Strategy for G.C. l-W Program
Fred Unruh
October 21, 1960

1. A PHILOSOPHY OF SERVICE

1. "Our understandings of the l-W program are focused first in the need to relate all things to the church of Christ and its teaching of the gospel under the Lordship of Christ. It is first of all in the commitment of men to Christ that we find meaning in the purpose of l-W.
 2. The church feels responsible to assist the l-W man to choose a Christian alternative to military service for which he is obligated by government decree.
 3. The church recognizes that the l-W is a young, maturing Christian, because of this the church considers l-W as a period of special opportunity in which to live and work as for a limited period of time directly in the context of church leadership and guidance.
 4. The church offers guidance in placement, places limitation on service choices, provides orientation, and challenges the l-W to sacrificial service in order to help the man realize the goal of the church and to witness for Christian faith and life, including the non-resistant peace witness."
- (From VS and I-W committee meeting June 15, 1960.)

2. ASSUMPTIONS FOR ADMINISTRATION

- a) That by careful work involving placement advisors, sharing of information about l-W openings, etc. we have a right to be consciously directive in our l-W placement and service program.
- b) That we have a right to determine service preferences as a church, and that our technique will be indirective, ie; by communicating positively those openings we prefer and de-emphasizing the less preferred.
- c) That we can have a good degree of flexibility in promoting openings and placing men, within this total framework.

3. PRIORITIES OF SERVICE

a) Because of the unit framework, the full time leadership structured and the inter-Mennonite encounter provided, as well as the service to deep felt human needs, we hold priority of Pax and VS. We hope to increase this group by an additional 10-15% within a year. See the below statistic summary.

b) "We are moving toward the establishment of several long term VS units with special priorities for l-W men in these units. The first of these will be to attempt to open a VS unit in connection with the Second Mennonite Church in Philadelphia. Two to three men are projected here. The Mennonite Mobile Disaster Service team will need about four men and will be located in Newton, Kansas. Canadian Mennonite Bible College has asked for one man for grounds and maintenance as a l-W. Thompson, Manitoba could well use two men in l-W positions there but we are not sure yet how USA l-Ws will respond to this unit. Our Chicago unit could well use from three to four men serving as l-Ws in nearby institutions which is an offer we have had for some time but have not quite been able to get men for. Lastly, we have a request from the Reedley General Conference Congregation to explore further the possibilities of a builder's unit at the Sierra View Senior Citizens Project. This is a large housing and service program for older people. This would not open up until a year from now. The listing of projects above is also our suggestion of how these units might be opened chronologically."

c) In this higher preferences list we also place those men serving in mission supporting l-W in earning locations regardless of place. The high rating is for the sacrificial nature of service given.

d) A church related earning placement in Mennonite institutions receives our enthusiastic response. Placements like at Mennonite Hospitals in Bloomington, Illinois or Beatrice, Nebraska; the maintenance or teaching staffs at our colleges; positions with our homes for the aged are included.

c) Church related earning service. Locations like Topeka, Kansas City, Allentown, Newton, Denver, and possibly in the future Fresno and Ft. Wayne. Here new extension churches would gain from the presence of our l-Ws and our l-Ws need the help of the new churches.

4. NEW l-W CONCENTRATIONS

We can expect to periodically see a shift of interest of l-W youth shifting from one area to another. In recognizing the possibilities of such shifts, we must be prepared in advance to structure our service to them.

Indianapolis is a new concentration. It likely will grow slightly and maintain its strength. We need to develop our pattern of serving our men there.

Fresno, California may become a new G.C. l-W unit if exploration is successful. Men appear to be interested in a West Coast unit. If we "open" Fresno I anticipate a good sized unit there.

Fort Wayne may also be among the newer l-W locations for G.C. Likely we may not see any large groups soon, but Ft. Wayne holds possibilities for an expanded unit in the future.

5. TRAINING SCHOOLS

We project a system of about five training schools annually. Pending explorations with our colleges and consultations with our district Peace and Service committees we project the following:
