#### CHAPTER VI

# BETHEL ATHLETICS FROM 1941 TO 1950

# 1940-1941

Bartel and Staerkel on All-KCAC football team. The 1940 Unruh eleven was headed by Captain Bill Staerkel. The roster included fifty-five players. The season record was four wins and six losses, and in the Conference it was one and five for seventh place. The team included five who received recognition from one source or another. The KCAC selected Roy Bartel, fullback, and Bill Staerkel, guard, on the first team and placed tackle Elton Krehbiel on the second team. Louis Turner received honorable mention. The newspapers gave recognition to Roy Bartel, Elton Krehbiel, Bill Staerkel and Marvin Westerman.

The old court in Alumni Hall was being remodeled for the museum and Memorial Hall was in the process of being completed. The new hall was designed to bring basketball back to the campus. Since 1936 the games had been played in Lindley Hall, the high school gymnasium. The season record was two games won and sixteen lost. In KCAC play Bethel won one and lost eleven for seventh place. Charlie Rousell received All-Conference second team recognition.

Bethel chosen "Upset King" of the year. The 1941 Graymaroons

were voted "Upset King" of the year by the Associated Press. The major upset of the football season was the one over Baker, a team that was undefeated, untied and unscored on going into the Baker-Bethel game, which Bethel won 6 to 0. Only once was the Bethel goal line crossed during the season and this kept them from winning their first KCAC championship. The thirty-one member squad was led by Captain Elton Krehbiel. Coach Unruh was assisted by Andy Douglass. Four Graymaroons were selected for the All-KCAC first team. They were Roy Bartel, fullback; Bill Staerkel, guard; and the tackles Elton Krehbiel and Oliver Duerkson. Bartel and Staerkel were repeaters from a year earlier. Honorable mention recognition was given to Marvin Dester, Willard Jantz, Eugene Reusser, Gene Unruh and Marvin "Bus" Westerman. The season record was six wins, one loss and one tie; the Conference record was four-one-one. Bethel was second to Baker in the final standing.

In the Conference tournament the doubles team, Charlie Voth (captain) and Paul Albrecht, placed second to Bethany in the finals after defeating Baker in the semi-finals. Bethel lost dual matches to Bethany and Fort Hays. The team won from Friends twice, five to one and four to one, and from Kansas Wesleyan five to zero. Only Paul Albrecht received an award. 13

## 1942-1943

The Graymaroons did not win a Conference football game in 1942 but came up with two non-Conference victories and a tie. The win against Fort Hays Teachers College was an unanticipated one. Kansas State College had cancelled their game with Fort Hays and Coach Unruh agreed to the game with reluctance. The 1942 team was made up of 4-F classified mem, divinity students and a few boys below draft age.

Coach Unruh's squad played inspired ball to win over the favored Fort Hays team. 16

Balzer receives KCAC recognition. The 1942-1943 Graymarcon basketball team was led by co-captains Harold "Buck" Balzer and Earl Bartel. Balzer scored 207 points for an average of 12.5 points per game. The season included eight victories and ten defeats. The Conference record was four wins and eight losses, Bethel finishing sixth.

Varsity awards were received by Harold Balzer, Harvey Goering, Lloyd Goering and Erwin Wiens.<sup>20</sup>

Athletic program discontinued due to war conditions. Track and tennis teams were preparing themselves for the forthcoming season when faculty action cancelled all schedules on March 31.21

Coach Unrub released to join Red Cross. After the 1942-1943 school year Otto Unruh resigned his position as director of athletics and physical education to go into Red Cross work. Succeeding Unruh was Verney Unruh, a college junior. Intercollegiate athletics had been dropped, and only a few men remained at Bethel. 22

# 1943-1945

No intercollegiate athletic program was carried on due to the war conditions.

# 1945-1946

Intercollegiate athletic program after two years lay-off. Representatives from the Conference member schools met in Topeka October 13, 1945, and planned the athletic program for the coming year. Competition was resumed with the basketball season.<sup>23</sup>

Graber and Kaufman appointed athletic coaches. Eldon Graber

joined the faculty as instructor of speech, dramatics and mathematics, and coached basketball. Peter R. Kaufman joined the faculty as instructor in industrial arts and director of recreation and physical education. His duties also included coaching track and tennis. 24

Board reintroduces football. President Kaufman of Bethel announced to the student body that the post-war plans include intercollegiate football. Recommended by the faculty, approved by the board and unanimously favored by the student body was the board resolution:

"that with the academic year of 1946-1947 football be reintroduced into Bethel Gollege for a three-year probationary period as an intercollegiate sport, with the definite understanding that high levels of characterter, sportsmanship, scholarship and methods of recruiting students and players be maintained." The plans also included a strong recreation and intramural program for every student.<sup>25</sup>

The 1946 Graymaroon basketball team was composed of below draft age boys and several 4-F's. Captain Kenneth Schroeder was the hub of the team. He averaged ten points per game. The season record was six wins and ten defeats. In Conference play Bethel won three and lost seven, placing sixth. Kansas Wesleyan did not participate, which accounts for only ten KCAC games.

The tennis team participated in two dual matches with Bethany. Bethany won the first four to two, and the second ended in a three to three tie. No Conference tournament was held. Varsity awards were granted to Earl Franz, Melvin Funk and Ivan Ratzlaff. 28

The track team placed third in the Wichita University invitational meet with eighteen points, behind Wichita University with one hundred one and El Dorado Junior College with twenty-eight. Friends placed fourth with six. In the Conference track meet Bethel placed fifth. Four received athletic awards: David Habegger, Howard Kaufman, Allen Reimer and Kenneth Schroeder. 29

Tully becomes athletic director and coach. Robert Tully of
Laverne College in California was appointed new athletic director and
coach of all sports. He had previous coaching experience in Ohio and
Indiana high schools. 30

The 1946 football team had a number of pre-war lettermen among the forty that reported for the fall sport. The team did not win many ball games but played them close and exciting. The season record included two victories and six losses while in the KCAC Bethel had a one and five record. Coach Tully was assisted by Eldon Graber and P. R. Kaufman.
