## APPENDIX B

## BETHEL COLLEGE LETTER CLUB ACTIVITIES

- The Bethel College Letter Club was organized on January 13, 1920.

  The organization was open for membership to any student that had received the "B". The Bethel "B" was awarded as special recognition to students participating in athletics, debate and oratory. The club included thirteen chartered members with Luke Horsch as the first elected president.
- 1922 A constitution was adopted. The Bethel "B" was to be presented only as an athletic award. This restricted the membership to those participating in intercollegiate athletics.
- 1924 Programs between halves of basketball games. Sponsored a banquet for football and basketball teams.
- 1926 Sponsored a Letter Club reunion which became an annual event.
- 1927 Project—construction of a cinder track with a concrete curb and drainage ditches.

  Campaign for "A Hundred Fives".
- 1928 Sponsored a benefit basketball game.
- 1929 Sponsored the Harvey County High School Track and Field Meet.

  This became an annual event until Harvey County League was dissolved.
  - Spensored the Harvey County Rural Grade School Track Meet, which has been an annual project until this time.

- 1934 Project to rebuild the tennis courts and sponsored the Little
  Arkansas Valley Track and Field Meet.
- Barbecue was sponsored to replace the annual Letter Club reunion.

  Dr. Dean Naismith, the inventor of the game of basketball, of the University of Kansas, was invited as guest speaker. Special guests were two high school basketball teams, the Newton Class A championship basketball team and the Class B championship team from Pretty Prairie. There were 300 in attendance.
- 1937 Fran Welch of Kansas State Teachers College of Emporia was the speaker at the second annual Buffalo Barbecue, which had 400 in attendance.
- 1938 Dr. Forrest "Phog" Allen of the University of Kansas was the speaker at the third annual Buffalo Barbecue. The attendance was 500.
- 1939 William Carey of Hutchinson, who had played football at Cornell and Lacrosse at Oxford, was the speaker at the fourth annual Buffalo Barbecue with 500 in attendance.
- 1940 A twenty-four page booklet called "The Graymaroon Gridder" was published. It included pictures and write-ups of the games on the schedule.

A project was to build three golf greens on the old football field.

Forrest "Phog" Allen was the fifth annual Buffalo Barbecue speaker where 500 were in attendance.

- 1941 Continued on the project to build three golf greens.

  Chuch Hyatt, eight time all-American basketball player and former coach of the Phillips 66 Oilers, was the sixth annual Barbecue speaker. The attendance was 450.
- 1942 Honus "Hans" Wagner, a member of the Baseball Hall of Fame, was the speaker at the seventh annual Buffalo Barbecue, where 400 were in attendance.
- 1948 The Buffalo Barbecue was renewed after a lapse of five years.

  Adolph Rupp, basketball coach at Kentucky University, was the speaker. Senior athletes of the high schools in the area were invited as guests. The total number who attended were 500.
- 1949 Jack Mitchell, quarterback of the Oklahoma University football team, was the speaker at the minth annual Buffale Barbecue. Attendance was 600.
- 1950 Robert "Bob" Richards, Olympic pole vaulter, was the speaker at the tenth annual Buffalo Barbecue with 550 in attendance.
- 1951 Stu Holcomb, football coach at Purdue University, was the speaker at the eleventh annual Buffalo Barbecue. The attendance was 500.
- 1952 The speaker at the twelfth annual Buffale Barbeque was Forrest "Forddy" Anderson, basketball coach at Bradley University.

  Attendance was 500.
- 1953 At the thirteenth annual Bethel Barbeque, "Bud" Wilkinson, football seach at the University of Oklahoma, was the guest speaker. Attendance was 600.
- 1954 Gil Dodds, holder of the world's indpor mile record and one of

- the greatest milers in American track history, was the speaker at the fourteenth annual Buffalo Barbeoue where 550 attended.
- 1955 A project was to build a link backstop for the tennis courts.

  The speaker at the fifteenth annual Buffalo barbecue was Fred

  "Tex" Winter. The attendance was 560.
- 1956 Beebe Lee, former basketball coach at the University of Colorado and new director of athletics at Kansas State College, was the speaker at the sixteenth annual Buffalo barbecue. The attendance was 560.
- 1957 The seventeenth annual Buffalo Barbecue attracted 650 with Don Faurot, director of athletics and former football coach at the University of Missouri.
- 1958 Ernie Mehl. sports editor of the <u>Kansas City Star</u>. was the speaker at the eighteenth annual Buffalo Barbecue. The attendance was 600.
- 1959 The speaker at the nineteenth annual Buffalo Barbecue was Dan Devine, football coach at the University of Missouri. The attendance was 650.
- 1960 Dick Harp, basketball coach at the University of Kansas, was the speaker at the twentieth annual Bethel Buffalo Barbecue which had an attendance of 700.

## RULES FOR RECORDING AND REPORTING NAIA FOOTBALL STATISTICS

NOTE: All yardage reported is to be NET yardage. Subtract losses from gains to get net.

### RUSHING

- All offensive running plays are to be classified as rushing plays, not as "plays from scrimmage," since any play begun with a snap-back from center actually is a play from scrimmage. Rushing yardage is measured from the line of scrimmage to the point where the ball is declared dead, or is recovered by opponents in the case of a fumble.

  All gains on lateral passes which originated or grew out of a rushing play are included in rushing yardage.

- FORWARD PASSING
  1. Forward passing gains or losses are measured from the scrimmage line to the point where the ball is declared dead (or is recovered by opponents in the case of a fumble), so as to include both length of pass and running advance after completion. All yards gained or lost on each completed pass play are credited to both the passer and the receiver.
- Loss from a completed forward pass which did not advance the ball to the scrimmage line is a yardage charge against passing
- Any loss by a player apparently intending to pass, but thrown behind the line of scrimmage, is recorded as a loss by rushing. He is not a passer until he has thrown the ball, and he retains
- He is not a passer until he has thrown the ball, and he retains at all times the option of running. Interception returns are measured from the point of interception to the point where the ball is declared dead (or is received by opponents in the case of a fumble.) There is no pass completed by penalty. A gain through interference on a passing play is a penalty against the defending team. The passer is not charged with a pass attempt, nor credited with a pass attempt, nor credited. with a pass completed or yards gained; nor is the intended receiver (or the player interfered with) credited with a pass caught. The passing team is credited only with a penalty, and the distance from the line of scrimmage to the spot of the penalty, under "yards penalized."

### LATERAL PASSING

- NTERAL PASSING

  A lateral pass is always a component part of the ultimate play, whether it precedes or follows that play, since the lateral is merely an extension of the original or ultimate play, in effect. Incomplete lateral passes are scored as fumbles, and yards lost are charged against the player who, in the scorer's opinion, was responsible for the failure of the pass.

  Intercepted lateral passes are scored as fumbles, the offensive term heters charged with a fumble lost.
- team being charged with a fumble lost. The official scorer rules on whether a completed pass to a flanker or man-in-motion is a forward or a lateral pass. If the latter, the play is recorded under "rushing." If the pass is incomplete, the subsequent action of the officials reveals whether the pass is a forward or a lateral.
- The original ball carrier is charged with an attempt (carry) and is given yardage to point of the lateral. The subsequent ballcarrier(s) are not charged with an attempt (carry) but do receive credit for yardage gained or lost from point of lateral.

### TOTAL OFFENSE

- Total offense is the combined result of rushing and forward passing only, since these two are the only methods by which legal advance can be initiated while retaining possession of the ball.
- Total offense yardage is the total of net gain by rushing and net gain by forward passing. "Receiving" yards gained are net included in total offense.

### PUNTS

- Punts are measured from the line of scrimmage to the point where the ball is touched or caught by an opposing player after it has passed the original line of scrimmage.
- If an opposing player gains possession of the ball, he is not charged with a punt return attempt unless he attempts to return the ball. If he attempts to return the ball, he is charged with

- yards gained attempting to return a punt, or yards lost, depending on where the bail is declared dead or is lost by a fumble.
- (Please note that a player may be charged with MINUS YARDS on a punt return.)
- on a punt return.)

  3. When a punt goes over the goal line (a touchback), distance of the punt is measured from the line of scrimmage to the goal line under new rule adopted in August of 1965.

  4. Punts blocked ere included in "times kicked", and the yardage of a partially blocked kick is included in "yards kicked". If the ball travels toward the kicker's goal and is recovered by the blocking (defending) team, the yardage is treated as a punt return by the player who blocked the kick. If the ball travels toward the kicker's goal and is recovered by the kicking team, the yardage is treated as a kick return by the player who blocked the kick, but the blocking team is charged with a fumble lost.

### KICK RETURNS

- Only the number of punts and kickoffs which the receiving team actually attempts to return are included under kick returns.

  The return shall be measured from the point where the returning
- player actually attempts to return the ball to the point where the ball is declared dead or is lost by a fumble. Please note that a player may be charged with MINUS YARDS on a punt return
- The return of an attempted field goal, which falls short and is returned by the defending team, is treated as a punt return.

Free kicks are recorded as kickoffs, if made from placement, and as punts, if the ball is punted. The receiving player is credited with a kickoff return, or a punt return, respectively.

1. Successful field goals are measured from the "foot", that is where the ball was held when kicked, to the goal post. The ten yards between the goal line and goal posts are included in the distance. The distance of such kicks is not recorded under "punting."

## POINTS AFTER TOUCHDOWNS

- A player attempting a try for point-after-touchdown by kicking is not charged with an attempt when a bad pass from center, or a fumble by the ball holder, precludes an opportunity to kick. Such an unsuccessful attempt is charged to the "team," rather than to any individual player. However, if the ball is momentarily fumbled and then kicked, an attempt is charged to the individual kicker, regardless of the success or failure of the effort.
- When try for point-after-touchdown by passing is successful, receiver is charged with attempt and with point scored. When pass is unsuccessful, passer is charged with attempt. When point is scored by rushing, ball carrier is credited with attempt
- All members using the optional one or two-point system of point-after-touchdown must list double entry under PAT scored. Be sure your total points check on this item.

 SAFETIES
 No individual credit is recorded for any player on either team when a safety is scored. The team benefiting from the score is credited.

### FUMBLES

- On any play terminated by a fumble, the yards involved to the point of recovery are credited or charged to the player who fumbled, regardless of which team recovers the fumble.
  - (Example On rushing play, ball carrier of Team A fumbles at the line of scrimmage and the ball travels 5 yards toward Team B goal line, before it is recovered by Team B. Player of Team A who fumbled is credited with rushing gain of 5 yards, and Team A is charged with a fumble lost.)

### WILD PASS FROM CENTER

Any loss resulting from an obvious wild pass from center is charged to "center pass", and not to any individual player.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

The home team statistician is the official statistician and should provide a copy of the statistics, both team and individual to the visiting team upon request. However, it is desirable for both home and visiting statisticians to work together so that game statistics of each will agree.

Any appearance in a game while the clock is running constitutes a game played even though the player does not come in contact with the ball. Include only results of games played against four-year, degree-granting institutions. Games against junior colleges, service teams, semi-pro teams, club teams, and alumni teams are not reportable.
