A SYNOPSIS OF THE LIFE OF

PETER B. RUTH

Peter Ruth was born in Harreszell, Upper Bavaria, on January the twenty second in the year of 1840.

He was a son of Jacob Ruth and Barbara Strohm. He spent part of his youth in Harreszell. At the age of twelve years he came to America with his mother, one brother and three sisters. They arrived in New York on August the fourth in the year of 1852. His oldest brother, Henry, arrived here one year earlier.

The family intended to settle in the Summerfield, Illinois area but upon their arrival in Saint Louis, found an epidemic of cholera raging in the area. The group changed their original plans and decided to go to West Point, Lee County, Iowa where another group had settled about a month previously.

They arrived in West Point on the twenty second of September and made their home there until on the eighth day of February in the year of 1853 when they moved to a farm they bought on the Franklin Prairie.

In the year of 1854, Peter B. Ruth confessed his faith in God and was baptized and received into the Zion Mennonite Church on the Franklin Prairie in Lee County, Iowa by his uncle, the Reverend David Ruth.

They lived on their farm on the Franklin Prairie until the eleventh of April in the year of 1856 when they moved to Saint Clair County, Illinois to a farm they bought two miles south of the Leisy place. This was the farm home just north of the Ruth School.

Peter was sixteen years old when the family moved onto this farm, and there is where he grew into manhood and lived in that home for some time.

On the twenty third day of September in the year of 1862, Peter Ruth and Valentine Krehbiel purchased 80 acres of land east of the road on which the house was located and 30 acres out of the north end of the 80 acres located just west of this road.

In the spring of 1867, Peter Ruth married Barbara Strohm. She was the second daughter of Peter Strohm and Barbara Schowalter. This union was blessed with five children, but unfortunately, only two survived. The two who survived were Oscar and Bertha K.. Oscar was born on August the twenty seventh in the year of 1872 and is still living at this writing. Bertha K. was born on the twenty ninth of April in the year of 1874. She passed away on September the third in the year of 1954.

On the fourth day of March in the year of 1874, Valentine Krehbiel sold his share of the farm to his brother-in-law, Peter B. Ruth.

On the twenty seventh of June in the year of 1875, Barbara Ruth, Nee Strohm, passed away. She was born on the Schwaig, Upper Bavaria on the twenty first of August in the year of 1844. Her earthly remains were lain to rest in the Summerfield Cemetery.

On the third day of September in the year of 1876, Peter Ruth was married for a second time, to Mary E. Baer. She was the second child of Christian Baer and Katherine Berger. Mary E. was born at Ridge Prairie on the twenty ninth of October in the year of 1855. She passed away on the fifth of January in the year of 1950. Her earthly remains rest in the Summerfield Cemetery at Summerfield, Illinois.

This union was blessed with eight children, three of which died in infancy. The others attained an age averaging 65 years. Alfred is alive at this writing.

In July of the year of 1883, Peter Ruth purchased a farm from his father-in-law. 160 acres of land for \$80.00 per acre. This was a rather large enterprize for him and they had to work hard and diligently for a long while before they had everything in order. It was on the twenty ninth day of February in the year of 1884 when they moved onto it to make their home.

On the eighth of March in the year of 1892, Peter Ruth sold the 110 acres of land north of the School, to his brother, David B. Ruth.

Peter Ruth was suffering from a liver ailment and a tumor on his stomach. Fortunately, he did not have much pain or discomfort. It was in the year of 1892 that complications began to set in. He was under the care of Doctor Comstock of Saint Louis for nineteen months. He was not confined to his bed for very long but he vomited a lot. As soon as he became aware of his fate, he calmly prepared himself and placed himself into the hands of his Creator.

He passed away on the ninth day of January in the year of 1893. His earthly remains were lain to rest in the Summerfield Cemetery. His day of passing and interment were on the same day and month as those of his father, who passed away in the year of 1848.

He was survived by his bereaved widow, six sons, Oscar, Gustav, Harry, Wesley, Robert and Alfred, and one daughter, Bertha K.. All of the children except Wesley, Robert and Alfred were born in the Ruth Home north of the Ruth School. Wesley, Robert and Alfred were born in the home two miles from Summerfield.

There was an adopted daughter, Selma Little Tree, a Cheyenne Araphoe Indian, born in Indian Territory. She was born in the year of 1881 and taken into the Ruth home in July of the year of 1885, at the age of four years. Selma attended public and Sunday Schools and Church services. She was baptized and taken into the church by Reverend Carl Van der Smissen. She was stricken with consumption and passed away on May the second in the year of 1902. Her earthly remains rest in the Summerfield Cemetery.

Peter Ruth was active in the Mennonite Church. He was song leader when Reverend Christian Krehbiel was the minister. How long he served in this capacity or what other service he gave the church is not known. It is evident that he was a conscientious worker who gave much of his time for the welfare of the Church. He was loved and trusted by all who knew him and his funeral text was the twenty third Psalm.

OSCAR PETER RUTH-ABIGAIL RINGELMAN FAMILY

A SYNOPSIS OF THE LIFE OF

OSCAR PETER RUTH

Oscar Peter Ruth, a son of Peter Ruth and Barbara Strohm, was born at Summerfield, Illinois on August the twenty fifth in the year of 1872. He was born in the old Ruth home located one quarter mile north of the Ruth School. He spent the days of his youth in and about the Summerfield area. In his late teens he was baptized upon confession of faith and joined the Mennonite Church of Summerfield, Illinois.

He served several years in the United States Army and was a participant in the invasion of Cuba during the Spanish American War.

In the year of 1898 Oscar went to Geary, Oklahoma where he joined the First Mennonite Church of Geary and remained a faithful member until he passed away on the twelfth day of March in the year of 1961.

On January the twenty fourth in the year of 1901, he was united in marriage with Abigail Ringelman by Reverend J. S. Krehbiel. This union was blessed with four children, two sons and twin daughters. The one twin, named Hazel, died in her infancy.

Oscar Ruth was a conscientious person with a keen sense of responsibility as to his esteemed place in the community as well as in the church of his faith. He helped to organize the Community fire department of which he was a member for twenty eight years and served in the capacity of chief for seventeen years. He was active in the construction of the Geary Mill and served as it's fireman for several years. He was light and water commissioner for seventeen years and city treasurer for ten years. He was well known as a volunteer weather observer for forty eight years and was regarded as being one of the most conscientious and faithful observers by influential members of the United States Weather Bureau.

In the Church of his faith he was a Sunday School teacher and superintendant for many years, deacon of the church and the church secretary for many years. He was chairman of the Historical Committee when the Congregation celebrated it's fiftieth anniversary as an organized body. He compiled a sketch covering the period of time from April the nineteenth, 1892 when the part of Oklahoma that was known as the Cheyenne and Arapahoe Indian Reservation was opened to white settlers, until in 1947, the fiftieth anniversary of the Congregation as an organized body. A copy of the sketch can be found in the historical section of the Ruth Family Genealogy.

A lot of the early history of the Ruth family has taken place in the village of Summerfield, Illinois and the surrounding area. Since Oscar Ruth was born in this area and being what we term an old-timer, he was an invaluable aid in helping with compiling data in connection with events that occurred long ago. He had a wonderful memory for the recollection of dates and events and could verify many interesting stories that we obtained from other sources. It was with the help of Oscar and Abigail, his wife, that we located the most complete early history of the Ruth family.

Oscar was a great help to us with the orientation of the many families who lived in Summerfield and on the farms in the surrounding area, supplying us with the data on which farm and in which home each family lived, along with the location of the various stores and business houses in Summerfield during the period of from about 1875 until about the year of 1900.

Oscar Ruth and Albert Auernheimer were pals, both being the same age. For a time their homes were just a short distance apart and they used to call to one another across the fields. Oscar recalled many other familiarities about one or more of his close friends and relatives, usually in the form of some harmless prank or witty remark. The sketch about the old Ruth School contains one of the incidents Oscar recalled.

One of the stories he recalled was in connection with the old flour mill at Summerfield and the fast west bound daily train that passed through town each day at one o'clock. Each day as the train passed the flour mill, the engineer of the mill would blow his whistle and the engineer of the train would blow his in answer. They seemed to be enjoying this method of saluting one another each day for a long time until an inspector for the Railroad Company heard of their daily prank and came to Summerfield to check on it's veracity. After witnessing this incident himself, he issued these orders, henceforth, should the engineer of the train ever blow his whistle as he passed the mill, he would be fired. For a long time after that, the engineer of the mill would blow his whistle when the west bound train passed and would watch the look of disdain on the face of the engineer, who was very anxious to give an answer with his whistle, but was afraid to do so for fear of losing his job.

Oscar loved to be out in the open and that is why he made his home in a small town where each home was built on a large lot with a large yard around it. He did not feel at ease in the large cities because the houses were all so close together. Even small towns, that had most of the homes built upon small lots and had a small yard or no yard at all, gave him a feeling of being fenced in.

Oscar Peter Ruth reached the age of eighty eight years, six months and fifteen days. His earthly remains were interred in the burial grounds at Geary, Oklahoma. Survivors are; Abigail, his beloved wife; two sons, Nelson and Kent; one daughter, Helen; two grandsons, Jon and Charles Ruth, a host of relatives and friends. At the time of Oscar's passing, Helen and Kent were living at home, Nelson was located in Weybridge, England, in connection with his work, Jon Ruth was in Carlisle, Pennsylvania and Charles Ruth was in Berlin, Germany.

Considerable time was spent, together with a lot of corresponding, in an effort to obtain all of the necessary information for the genealogical record of this family. Several letters were written to the two sons, Alfred and Wesley but neither one of them ever answered. The information we have was supplied by a few of the close relatives.
