I was born at Hesston, Kansas on the eleventh of March, 1913. After graduation from Hesston Academy I kept house at home, my mother having had passed away in my junior year.

I was married to Reuben Mathias Coopriders in Enid Oklahoma by the Reverend M. D. Landis, an ex-school teacher of ours, on November the fourteenth, 1934.

We resided in Hesston, Kansas for four months and then Reuben was transferred to Inman, Kansas where we lived until in 1941, the time when he entered the service.

During his four years in the service our time was divided between Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and Southport, North Carolina. Reuben served fourteen months of this time overseas.

While in these areas we were associated with the First Mennonite Church in Philadelphia and with the Southern Baptist Church in Southport, North Carolina and we treasure very highly all of the experiences we had and also the friendships we made.

In 1945, at the time of Reuben's discharge from the services, we moved to Reedley, California where my father was living. We built a home there expecting to stay there permanently but 1951 found us in Southern California. We like it here very much. Our daughter Nancy is attending the Bible Institute of Los Angeles and as a family we are all very active in the Immanuel Mennonite Church in Downey.
