PAUL F. SCHOWALTER-IRENE MARIE EYMANN FAMILY

A SYNOPSIS OF THE LIFE OF

PAUL F. SCHOWALTER
AND
IRENE EYMANN

Paul F. Schowalter was born near Halstead, Kansas on the twelfth of August in the year of 1885. He was a son of Jacob Schowalter and Elizabeth Ruth.

In the year of 1904 he went to Upland, California with his parents and was associated with his father, growing citrus fruits.

On December the eleventh in the year of 1913, he was married to Miss Irene Eymann, formerly of Moundridge, Kansas and now also of Upland. The bride was the daughter of Herman August Eymann and Anna Marie Rauscher. They were married in Upland, California.

After the death of his parents, the couple moved into the parental Schowalter home in Foothill where they resided for many years until they built a home in their citrus grove located near Cugamonga.

Mr. Schowalter passed away at his ranch home near Cugamonga while watching a television program on the twenty third day of November in the year of 1957. He reached the age of a little over seventy two years.

In the passing of Paul Schowalter, the Church and Community has lost a most outstanding leader. In the years gone by he easily survived two major surgeries for stomach ulcers but the permanent heart condition he developed made it necessary to withdraw from many of his activities. He was president of the Cugamonga Mesa Growers when he passed away but his fifteen odd years he served as a Boy Scout Leader were then only pleasant memories. In the Church, he had to decline his re-election as president, a position he held for many years, but willingly offered his assistance as the vice president to help a younger leader with his council and advice. The shedding of responsibilities did not mean that he had lost interest in the Church

because he was faithful to the end and always helped as much as his strength would permit.

Being well aware of the seriousness of his heart condition, he gave evidence that he was prepared and ready to go and was listening for his Master's call. It came suddenly while watching a television program and unfortunately, at a time when his wife was away for but a short time.

Survivors of the immediate family are; his widow, Mrs. Irene Schowalter, Nee Eymann; a daughter, Mrs. John Biel and family of Marvista; a son, Donovan and family of Upland and a host of relatives and friends of both sides of the family.

Funeral services were held in the First Mennonite Church of Upland, pastor Paul Goering, officiating. The sanctuary was filled to capacity with sorrowing relatives and friends.

The profusion of beautiful floral offerings gave evidence of the high esteem in which he was held by those who knew and respected him. Interment was in the Belleview Cemetery, Ontario, California.

Additional information on this family appears in "The Sebys Genealogy". It is a history of the family in America, covering a period of from 1835 to 1949. It was published by the Dodd Printing Company, Fort Madison, Iowa.

It is rather interesting to learn that the Sebys came from Kindenheim in the Palatinate. This is but a short distance from Oberfloersheim where the Ruth family lived. Both families came to America and both made their first home in Lee County, Iowa. There has been no evidence that the families knew one another, but when they came to America, both families settled in Lee County, Iowa and made their first home there. In 1949 there were still 157 of the Seby descendants in Lee County, Iowa. The Ruth family moved from this area many years ago and at this date there is no one of our branch living in Lee County.
