In a large Bible which was my father's I find the following in his handwriting;

Jacob S. Krehbiel was ordained as Mennonite Missionary for Araphoe Indians August 7, 1892. Ordained at Gnadenburg, Kansas. Severed connections with the Mennonite Mission on June 30, 1897. Was ordained as Elder of Mennonite Church "Salem" at Geary, Blaine County, Oklahoma Territory, August 22, 1897.

My father, Jacob Samuel Krehbiel, moved with his parents, Reverend and Mrs. Christian Krehbiel, from Summerfield, Illinois, to Halstead, Kansas, when he was a young boy. They moved some time between 1879 and 1881. I do not have the exact date available.

He attended Halstead Seminary, the forerunner of Bethel College, located at North Newton, Kansas. In 1892 he went to Darlington, Oklahoma, as missionary to the Indians. Later on he was in charge of three mission stations in Oklahoma; Darlington, Cantonment and Shelley.

In the year of 1893, he participated in the run

for claims, when the Cheyenne and Araphoe Lands were opened for settlement by the Government. He located upon and received a patent for a 160 acre farm five miles north of Geary, Oklahoma. This farm he later traded for another 160 acre tract which was located just across the road.

He moved to his original Homestead in 1897 and there organized the First Mennonite Church of Geary. The original Church Building was moved into Geary in 1898. In 1899 he also moved into Geary with his wife and infant son, Adolf J. Krehbiel, who was born on the old Homestead on December 6, 1898.

The land for which the old Homestead was traded is yet owned by his sons, Adolf J. Krehbiel and Otto L. Krehbiel.

He served the Geary Congregation continuously as pastor from the time it was organized on August 15, 1897, until his death from pneumonia on the tenth of April, 1916.

Mother was a daughter of Frederick Ringelman and Louise Miller Ringelman. When she was a young girl she moved to Plumsteadville, Pennsylvania, with her parents. About 1888, she went to Halstead, Kansas, to work as a seamstress in a tailor shop. While she was employed in Halstead, she met and married father on May 7, 1889. They moved to Darlington, Oklahoma, in 1892 and to the farm north of Geary in 1897. She passed away at the family home on March 16, 1933.

A SHORT BIOGRAPHY OF THE LIFE OF

ADOLF JACOB KREHBIEL

Born on December 6, 1898, at Geary, Oklahoma, to Jacob Samuel Krehbiel and Katherine Ringelman.

Attended the Public Schools in Geary, graduating there from High School in 1916. With a three year interuption between the sophomore and junior years, attended Bethel College at North Newton, Kansas and graduated in 1923 with an A.B. Degree. Was the first editor of the Mennonite Weekly Review for two years following graduation from Bethel. Taught High School at Pretty Prairie, Kansas, 1925 to 1927, attending law school in the summer at University of Colorado. Then attended law school full time at the University of Kansas, graduating in the spring of 1929 with the degree of LL.B..

Moved to Clayton, New Mexico, on June 1, 1929 and have practised law there continuously since then. Assistant District Attorney from June 1929, to December 31, 1932.

Married Laura Riley at Lawrence, Kansas, on February 23, 1929, and was divorced in 1942. There were three children born to this marriage, namely; Reed Riley, Marcia Jean and Albert Jacob. The youngest son, Reed Riley, died on April 4, 1947, as a result of an automobile accident.

Married Frances Morgan on May the twenty-seventh, 1943, at Albuquerque, New Mexico, at the home of her parents, Doctor and Mrs. I. L. Morgan.

At that time, Doctor Morgan was District Superintendent of the Albuquerque District of the Methodist Church. Frances, graduated at Denver University, and was teaching in Clayton prior to our marriage.

We are members of the First Methodist Church of Clayton, at Clayton, New Mexico.

HENRY OTTO KRUSE

Born in Davidsfeld, Russia, on September 3, 1863, a son of Adolph Theodor Kruse and Margaretha Rupp. The Kruse family was from Rotterdam, Holland, Adolph was born at Altoona, the seaport of Hamburg, as they were a seafaring family and Margaretha Rupp was from Falkenstein, Galacia, Austria.

He emigrated from Russia to the United States and settled in the eastern part of the State of Kansas. Graduate of Kansas State Normal, Emporia, Kansas. Graduate of Kansas University, Lawrence, Kansas. Post graduate work at the University of Chicago.

A teacher--and an excellent one. Taught "District School", High School, Junior College and College in succession. Principal at Bethel College North Newton Kansas until being called to the Department of Germanic Languages and Literatures at the University of Kansas where he taught for many years. Not merely to teach the written languages, but the written and the musical literature of the people-----and their human wants and longings.

No teacher ever had more friends. At his death, hundreds came to bid him farewell.

His extensive Library went to the University of Kansas, Connecticut University and Bethel College.

Trained by a master wood-worker (his father) he left many fine pieces of cabinet work for us.

KATHERINA AMALIA KREHBIEL

Raised in the atmosphere of working religion at "Krehbiel-town" she was always extremely active in Church and Community work at Bethel College, and at Lawrence, Kansas, both in and out of the University.

A highly skilled needle worker she took prizes at World's Fairs repeatedly and left many fine pieces of the needle-arts to us.

Some time after the death of my father, she married Henry H. Ewert and removed to Gretna, Manitoba and worked with him at the Mennonite Collegiate Institute. Upon Mr. Ewert's death, she came to Madison, Connecticut and lived at the home of Robert S. Kruse and Madilene Elizabeth Kruse (Nee Carter) until her death on December 12, 1947.

She retained her United States citizenship while living in Canada.

HENRY H. EWERT

I am unable to supply an adequate account of the life of my stepfather, Henry H. Ewert. I do not know his birth date and place, but do know that the date of his death is December 30, 1934. His remains lie buried at Gretna, Manitoba, Canada.

He was Provincial Co-ordinator of Schools for the Province of Manitoba, Canada, and President of the Mennonite Collegiate Institute at Gretna, Manitoba.

He was a man who had great force of character and could not otherwise have held the job of Provincial Co-ordinator of Manitoba, Canada, as it is a Crazy-quilt of close-knit settlements, each one desiring to live in its own way and teach its own preferences in that area.

A SYNOPSIS OF THE LIFE
OF
HENRY H. EWERT
TEACHER AND PREACHER

On Saturday evening on December the twenty ninth, 1934 at nine P. M. Henry H. Ewert passed away at his home in Gretna Manitoba, Canada. His earthly remains were lain to rest on January the second, 1935.

He was born on the twelfth of April in the year of 1855 in Upper Nassau by Thorn in West Prussia. He came to America with his parents, three sisters and two brothers. They settled in Kansas where he went to school and chose the profession of teaching for a vocation. He taught school for a period of two years in the vicinity of where his parents resided. Thereafter, he studied for an advanced education. In the year of 1882 he was married to Elizabeth Baer in the village of Summerfield, Illinois.

A short time after this, he received a call from the newly founded Mennonite School in Kansas. He was the teacher and principal of this institution for a period of nine years.

He was also called to the General Conference as a preacher and was established as one. In the year of 1890, he received a call from the Provincial Government of Manitoba, Canada and at the same time, got a call from the Mennonite School Society in Gretna for the position as teacher of this school. He accepted both calls and moved to Gretna in the summer of the year of 1891. He served the Mennonite School for the period of forty three and one half years as teacher and principal. From 1891 to 1903, he was the Government School Inspector for Mennonite Schools in the Province of Manitoba, Canada. His main work was the creation of better schools and education. He was an active teacher for a period of fifty five years.

His prudent and cunning administration of Schools and education in that area has proven to be a landmark in that Province. He has done a most wonderful job for the Church and Government. He was also much concerned and interested in the Mennonite Church as a whole and spent much time to improve and abet this denomination.

On February the thirteenth 1925, he suffered the loss of his wife. She was the daughter of Christian Baer and Katherine Berger. She was born on February the twenty sixth, 1895, at Ridge Prairie, Illinois. She bore him five children, four sons and a daughter whose names are; Paul, Carl, Alfred, Willie and Elma. Her earthly remains lie buried in Gretna, Manitoba.

His second wife, Katherine Amalia Krehbiel Kruse, was the daughter of Christian Krehbiel and Susanna Ruth. Her first marriage was to Henry Otto Kruse and they had one son, Robert S. of Connecticut. She was born April the tenth 1867, at Summerfield, Illinois. She survived her second husband and passed away on December the twelfth, 1947, at Lawrence, Kansas.

He took charge of catechism instruction, a chore which was his usual practice from the closing of the schools until after the Christmas Holidays, examined and graded the examination papers of his students, passing censorship and giving honor wherever it was due.

The students went home to celebrate the Christmas Holidays without knowing that their beloved teacher had been called to his reward. On the morning of the twenty fourth of December, just before noon, he was active and interested in distributing little booklets to the Sunday School teachers. Later, he found it necessary to lay down in bed. He never was able to get up again after that. He remained in a sort of sleeping frame of mind and then on the twenty ninth, he passed away peacefully and happy and rests in the arms of his Creator. He attained the age of eighty years, three months and seventeen days.

He was survived by his sorrowing widow, four sons and one daughter; of these four sons, none found it possible to attend the funeral on account of the remote location and distance of travel. However, the widow Ewert's own son, Robert Kruse of Connecticut, came in time for the funeral. His mother was glad to see him and appreciated his being able to be there.

One brother, Reverend Benjamin Ewert of Winnipeg, and his wife were present. Also three sisters, Mrs. John W. Penner and widow Augusta Rempel of Hillsboro, Kansas, Mrs. Jacob J. Toews of Newton, Kansas and a host of relatives and friends, (also from the family side of his widow) mourned his passing.

But they do not mourn as such who do not believe in God for they have hope in the hereafter. They are comforted by Jesus Christ our Lord, who has power of life and death. Everyone knew that he was taken into his home on high and is now with his Creator.

He has fulfilled his duties and life here on this earth and preserved the Will of God. Henceforth, he will wear the crown of righteousness.

The funeral service was held on Wednesday afternoon on January the second, 1935, from the Mennonite School in Gretna. The weather was very stormy but it did not seem to have any affect on the attendance. A large crowd, estimated at about 600, came out to pay their last respects to this man. The service was by David D. Klassen of Halstead, the funeral addresses by Jacob Hoepfner of Winkler and Peter P. Tschetter of Freeman, South Dakota and twelve other brethren and friends of the beloved Henry H. Ewert spoke many words of commemoration and encomium. Among those who were present, was Dr. Seelheim, the German Counselor of Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada.

The preceding article was recorded in the Family History, written by Mrs. Peter Ruth, a sister of the first wife of Henry H. Ewert. The author is unknown.

Daniel R. Krehbiel was born on January the first, 1868 at Summerfield, Illinois, a son of the Reverend Christian Krehbiel and Sussana Ruth. They resided in Summerfield for many years and then moved to Kansas.

On the thirteenth day of October and in the year of 1898, he was married to Miss Terrie Kenney in the City of Newton, Kansas. She was a daughter of Isaac and Mary Jane Kenney and was born on the third day of December in the year of 1876 at Rebersburg in the State of Pennsylvania.

In the year of 1879 the family went west and made their home in Newton, Kansas where they lived for a number of years. She attended Newton High School and graduated from there in 1894. She was also a member of the first class that graduated from the Music Department of Bethel College.

The couple moved to Moundridge, Kansas where Mr. Krehbiel was associated with the Moundridge Milling Company prior to his death in 1921. The widow lived in Moundridge for several years and then moved back to Newton to make her home. In 1956 she moved to the Presbyterian Manor where she lived until she passed away on September the thirtieth in the year of 1959. She was eighty two years old and a pioneer resident of Newton, Kansas. She was an active member of the First Presbyterian Church, the Junior Reading Circle and a fifty year member of the Eastern Star.

The funeral services were held in the Church with the Rev. George W. Nelson and Rev. Floyd E. Kaiser taking part. Interment was in the Greenwood Cemetery with the Reverend John B. Covey officiating.
