MS.035. The Peter Siebert Goertz (1886-1948), Mathilde Harms Goertz and Helen Riesen Goertz Papers include a Central Asia (Dalke) Diary 1888 by Siebert Goertz.

MS.44 Gerhard A. Peters papers. Diaries and travel notes. Peters taught in Khiva in 1913. Not clear if the papers contain anything specifically about that experience.

MS.045. Central Asia Trek, 1880-1929. Assembled from descendants of persons involved in the trek (Penner, Jantzen, Toews, Klaassen). Includes correspondence, memoirs, articles plus minutes of American committees formed to aid and rescue the Mennonites in Asia. 0.3 cubic feet. (all digitized)

MS. 115. Hans Bartsch (1894-1959). Includes letters in German written to Johannes Bartsch and Anna Harms Bartsch, his parents, beginning *ca.* 1882 from relatives living in Russia or Central Asia. 0.3 cubic feet. (correspondence <u>partially digitized</u>, some has been transcribed and posted on https://neu.chortitza.org/kategorie/briefe/am-trakt-2/)

MS.118. Johannes K. Penner (1850-1924). These papers are unprocessed. Penner migrated to Central Asia in 1880 then to Beatrice, Nebraska in 1884.

MS.136. James C. Juhnke papers. Includes some material on his tour to Central Asia in 2007.

MS.203. Jacob H. Quiring. He preached in Central Asia as a Reiseprediger. Collection is unprocessed so not clear if there are papers related to that experience.

MS.255. Helena Graewe Warkentin papers. Diaries (starting in 1917), autobiography, Central Asia account. Moved to Central Asia in 1881 and to US in 1884.

MS.308. Elma Esau papers. Includes large set of letters from relatives in Russia. See also her book Russia Letters.

MS.549. Johann Jantzen diary. German original and handwritten English translation. He migrated to Central Asia in 1881 and to Nebraska in 1884. (digitized)

MS.572. Dov Yaroshevski Central Asia Papers. Israeli scholar who did some research on the Central Asia trek. (partially digitized)

MS.738. Peter J. Quiring and Helena Dalke Quiring papers. He was born in Central Asia. Not clear how much there is about Central Asia; much of the material is about World War 1 in Oklahoma.

Horn of Cordell, Oklahoma, in 1970; found in MLA.MLA.I (pre-1979 MLA office files), folder "Horn, Mrs. H. H.", further correspondence can be found there (digitized)
