BEDBUG EXTERMINATION PROCEDURE -

Before:

1. Take clothes that you need and toilet articles to Recreation hall and choose a cot.
2. Close windows and fire stove in dorm.
3. Fluff blankets and sheets loosely.
4. Open all trunks and boxes.

During Ext.

1. Married men granted emergency over night leaves the night their dorm is fumigated.
2. The rest of the men make Recreation hall your home.
3. Stay out of your dorm!!!

After:

1. Fold sheet used in Recreation hall and place in laundry shelf.
2. KEEP ALL WINDOWS OPEN.
3. Shake blankets and mattress before making bed.
4. Either place the clothes you were wearing in laundry or in next place to be fumigated to be sure everything de-bedbug-ized.
5. ENJOY A PLEASANT NIGHT'S SLEEP WITHOUT BEDBUGS.

FINANCING BED BUGS

The MCC is paying \$100.00 on the extermination project and the balance of the cost will be made up by assessment to the campers. The assessments levied is 25¢ per camper to be collected by the dorm Chairman. It is urged that if possible you contribute a few cents extra to make up for campers who cannot pay. (Dead bedbugs can be seen on the floor in fumigated dorm 2-3)
