On Wednesday Evening at 8:15 she will talk on "4½ Years of Guerilla Warfare" which covers the time of the Japanese occupation. On Sunday evening she will show the second group of slides of her work in China. The talk on Wednesday will be followed by a prayer service.

MCC REPRESENTATIVES HERE

Bob Kreider, William Snyder and Erwin Goering of the MCC will be here Saturday afternoon and Sunday morning to answer your questions on mental hospitals. They will have detailed information on the individual hospitals in which you might be interested.

The MCC is expecting 900 new assignments by July 1st and they don't expect to open any new base camps so the increase will be taken up in special projects.

HOOKWORM UNIT EXPANSION

The Brethren Unit of CPS 27 has been granted an increase of 40 men and 10 of these will come from the non-Mennonite men in MCC camps. The work consists of a combination of Health Work and Forestry Work. The unit is similar to the Mulberry unit with the addition of forestry work.

NEW SIDE CAMP

Three men were selected to do special survey work at Ordway, Colo. They write: "We are not in Pueblo, we are not in LaJunta, but we are here. Fooled you didn't we?"

Hotel Ordway in the big city of Ordway - population about 600-700. We arrived right after dinner, took our suitcases upstairs and went out to the field.....The fields are pretty muddy."

BASKETBALL

One of the men from the 2nd Air Force Statistical Control Unit called Ed Schmidt and suggested that we combine teams and enter the WRC tournament. The Boys' Club also called asking our men to play with them. We investigated the possibility of entering a team from the CPS camp and the matter was referred to the city manager who suggested we join other teams rather than enter a team ourselves because of the type of crowds that would attend the WRC tournament.

THE BODY OF OTIS RUSSEL FOUND

The last chapter to the manhunt by the CPS camp on January 21 & 22 was written last Sunday when the body was found 1 mile southwest of the Modern Woodmen Sanitorium. He died of cold and exposure. They estimated he had walked 7 miles. The boy was found by Mrs. M. R. Hull of Manitou Springs while they were hiking in that vicinity.
