SUNDAY MORNING



DEADLINE FOR LICENSE PLATES March 10

According to Mr. Drain, Supervisor of Highway Patrol, in Colo. Springs Gazette & Telegraph: "Subject to the Governor's proclamation, you are instructed to continue the policy of permitting vehicles with foreign license plates to operate until the end of our registration year. On and after that time all persons living in Colorado, or gainfully employed here, and who operate vehicles on foreign license plates, must buy and display a 1945 Colorado license plate. Also, vehicle operators who come within the provisions of this paragraph must secure a certificate of inspection and have a valid Colorado operators of Chauffeurs license."

COUNCIL MEETING
