
SUNDAY SERVICES

PURPOSE OF PAMPHLETS

This is a part of the introduction in the first pamphlet: "During recent years devout men have been using the scientific method in studying the Bible and this has resulted in a vast increase in our knowledge and understanding of the Christian Scriptures. Unfortunately much of this new information has been shut up inside the schools and has not been utilized by the plain people who go to the Bible for inspiration and help. As result many cults and sects have fattened upon the fact that lay people in large numbers remain ignorant of the background of the Bible and the conditions under which it came to its present completion. There is a great reverence for the Bible particularly among Christian people. But reverence that remains ignorant is sometimes as dangerous to the cause of good religion as outright antagonism. It is highly

important that the church shall give its people adequate and reliable information concerning the Book which is central in their faith."
