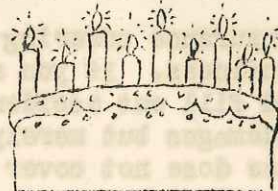
CPS Camp Pastor

This evening at 8:00 P.M. there will be a film program in the chapel. The following pictures on animal life will be shown


