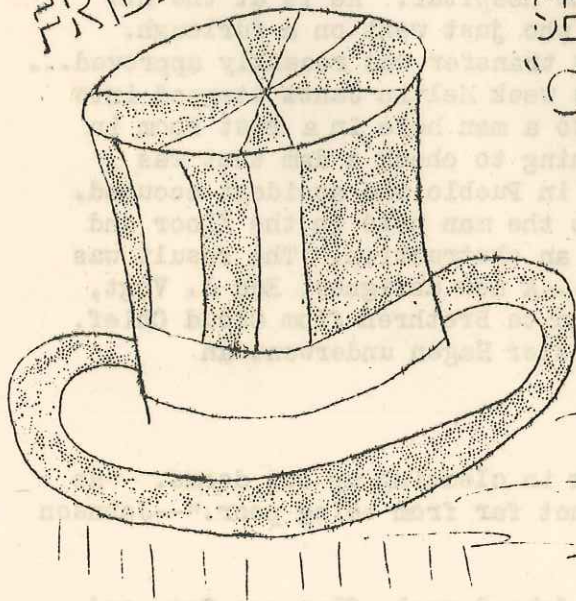
PRAYER MEETING

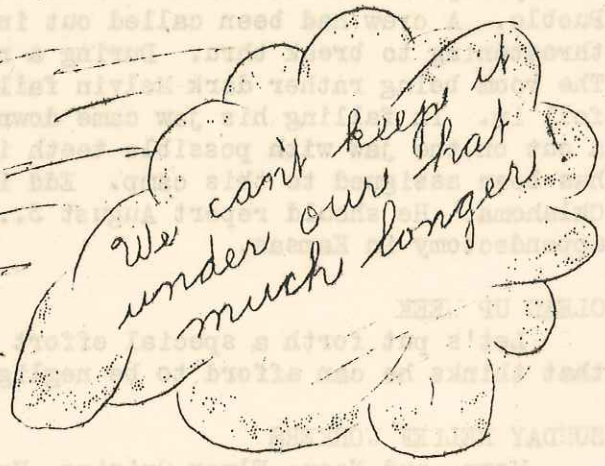
