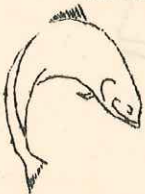
Wilbur Nachtigal, who has spent two years in Puerto Rico, has requested transfer to Colorado Springs. Approval has not been received as yet.

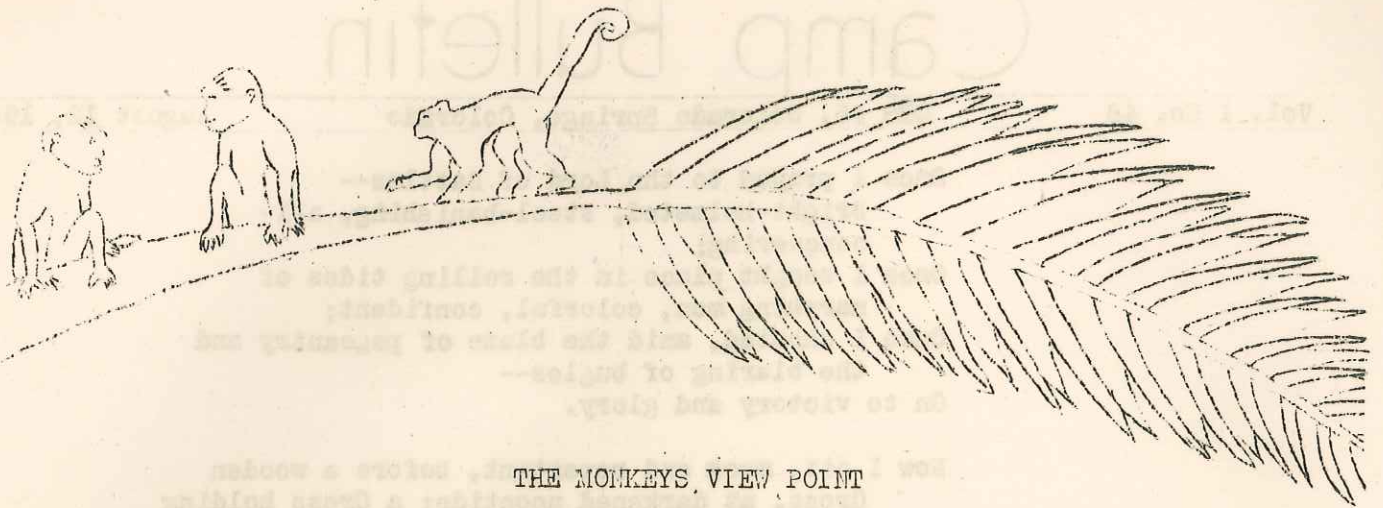
## SUNDAY RELIEF WORKERS
