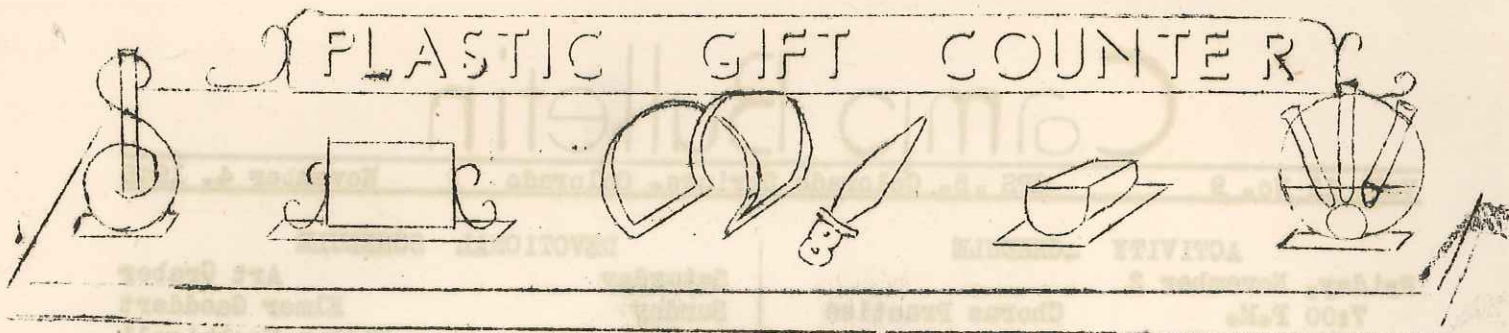
NO! NOT A NEW ASSIGNEE BUT FREE MEN
