Transferring guilt to others is one of the greatest temptations of man. It helps man to lower his enemy and elevate himself. The whole story of war can be boiled down to transferring guilt to the other fellow. Making the other fellow look bad, telling him off, placing blame on him, and talking behind his back is a part of this process.

You know what Jesus did to break this vicious cycle of transferring guilt to one another? He did the only thing that could stop it and that was to transfer the guilt of man on his own shoulders. He made himself sin so that we might become righteousness. By allowing his enemies to persecute him he raised himself. And with him he made it possible for his enemies to be raised also. Isn't that a practical technique to use in correcting wrongs?

An application of this truth would never allow us to blame anyone but ourselves for the condition of our life. It would mean that we would have to be willing to assume the guilt for acts never committed on our own part. It would imply that we are willing to help those whose guilt we have assumed. This seems like a hard way. But the way of the cross isn't easy.
